Introduction

Please find attached below, information on the Mine Safety Legislation Seminars being held by the **NSW Department of Primary Industries**.

The free seminars are being held around the state and will provide information on the mine safety legislative changes, new responsibilities and timeframes for implementation.

The seminars will benefit anyone in the metalliferous, extractives and opal mining industries who will need to comply with the new legislation.

Details

The recently gazetted *Mine Health and Safety Act 2004* and *Mine Health and Safety Regulation 2007*, as well as the proposed further extension of the *Occupational Health and Safety Regulation 2001* to the mining industry, create particular responsibilities for people in the metalliferous, extractives and opal mining sectors and set out new powers and administrative arrangements. To make it as easy as possible to comply with the new legislation, NSW DPI will host a series of industry information seminars throughout the state.

The free seminars will provide an outline of the new legislation, details on new responsibilities for duty holders and timeframes for implementation.

To ensure the seminars are relevant to all areas of the industry, they will be tailored to provide specific content based on the type and scale of mining mostly present in each region. Local NSW DPI Inspectors and Mine Safety Officers will also be available at each seminar to provide local content and answer questions. The seminars will be held at the following locations:
